Businessman shot at near Bhairon temple in 'robbery attempt', 2 held

New Delhi: A city-based busi-nessman was shot at by unidenti-fied blke-borne assailants in cen-tral Delhi's Tilak Margon Friday.

Police have arrested a 21-year-old man and apprehended a juvenile in connection with the case. The businessman, identifi-ed as RK Singh, was rushed to the hospital by his business associate and is currently under-

going treatment.
Police were informed about the incident around 10pm on May 2. "Police teams reached the spot and conducted a preliminary investigation. Singh told the cops that some unknown individuals on a motorcycle fired a round at him around 9pm near Bhairon

temple. Doctors were consulted regarding the condition of the injured, who was found to be out of danger," said DCP (New Delhi) Devesh Kumar Mahla.

Singh, who owns a perfume shop in Chandhi Chowk, was returning home to Noida after closing his shop when the assailants, who had been tailing him, opened fire near Bhairon Temple opened fire near Bhairon Templ on Tilak Marg. An injured Singh managed to contact his business partner, who promptly reached the spot and rushed him to the hospital. Police were informed about the incident through a call

from the hospital.

An FIR was registered under Section 109 (attempt to mur-

der) of BNS and sections of the Arms Act at Tilak Marg police

tion and formed six police te-ams to track down the suspects. The teams scanned CCTV footage from the surrounding areas to identify the attackers and tra-ce their escape route," a police officer said.

Based on the input received and information from multiple sources, police arrested a 21-year-old man, identified as Prashant alias Govind, and apprehant alias Govind, and appre-hended a juvenile in connection with the incident. Police suspect the motive may have been robbe-ry, although nothing was stolen from the victim.

Police nab 10 illegal B'deshi immigrants in separate raids

New Delhi: Delhi Police apprehended 10 illegal Bangla New Delhi: Delhi Police apprehended Il illegal Bangla-deshi immigrants in two separate operations across the city. According to police, a tip-off was received at Mandawali police station regarding the presence of suspected illegal immigrants in the Dheeraj Block area. "Acting swiftly on the input, a police te-am initiated an operation on April 29. During thera-id, one Bangladeshi woman was apprehended. Her interrogation led to the identification and subsequ-ent detention of five more Bangladeshi women from the Paharganj area," said DCP (east) Abhis-hek Dhania.

Preliminary investigations revealed that all six women were residing in India without valid documents for durations ranging from eight months to two years, frequently changing locations to avoid detection. Thorequently changing locations to avoid detection. Tho-se apprehended in this operation were identified as Mim Akhtar (23) and Meena Begum (35), both from Dhaka; Sheikh Munni (36) and Tamiya Khan (34) from different parts of Khulha district; Payal Sheikh (25) from Chattogram; and Sonia Akhtar (36) from Nator, northern Bangladesh.

In a separate operation on May 3, four more Bangladeshi nationals were detained from Azad-pur Sabzi Mandi.

The individuals arrested in this operation were The individuals arrested in this operation were identified as Mohammad Arri alias Shilpa (26), both from Chasara in Narayanganj district; Mohammad Jahid alias Mousam (21) from Panchwati in the same district; and Mohammad Babul alias Pakhi (40) from Tong Bazar, also in Narayanganj. Police said all four had entered India illegally with the help of agents and were using disguises and hormonal treatments to pose as members of the transgender community, helping them evade detection while residing and working in the city.

One municipal ward, Dwarka B, became vacant in
June last year when the sitting councillor, BdP's Kamaljeet Sehrawat, was elected to the Lok Sabha. The
councillors of the remaining II wards—Mundka,
Shalimar Bagh-B, Ashok Vihar, Chandni Chowk,
Chandni Mahal, Dichaon Kalan, Naraina, Sangam
Vihar-A, Dakshin Puri, Greater Kailash, and Vinod
Nagar—were elected as MLAS in the Delhi assembly

The Shalimar Bagh B councillor, Rekha Gupta, won the assembly polls and is now the chief minister

of Delhi.

According to officials, the SEC recently issued a gazette notification amouncing that instead of preparing fresh electoral rolls for each of the wards for use in the bypolls, it would adopt the electoral rolls of the respective assembly constituencies. It stated that the electoral rolls for the assembly constituencies were revised by the chief electoral officer of Delhi, with Jan J. 2025, as the qualifying date.

"Preparation of fresh electoral rolls for the above-said wards by this commission would entail a long time besides incurring expenditure in this respect, which could be safely avoided, "the SEC stated in the notification. It added that the supplementary electoral rolls prepared by the CEO's office as exis-



A comparison between the academic years 2014-15 and 2024-25 reveals a strong and consistent upward trend in both the number of Delhi govt schools offe-ring the science stream and ring the science stream and the student enrolment in it. However, still only about half of the govt schools in the city offer the stream, highligh-ting apersistent gap in access to science education.
